Liberty Chargers Social Probation Program

What is Social Probation?

In an attempt to curb student behavior and improve school attendance, Liberty High School will be implementing a Social Probation Program. Students who are placed on Social Probation will not be permitted to ATTEND or PARTICIPATE in school activities that occur after 2:10 pm. These activities include but are not limited to, team practices, games, band, chorus and drama events. Who is placed on Social Suspension? Students receiving a referral for a level two or one offense, students with 15 or more excessive unexcused tardies to school, students with 4 or more discipline level 3 or 4 referrals in a 9 week period, and students with 5 or more excessive school absences in a 9 week period. Students who are on Social Suspension will need to fulfill the terms of a social suspension contract with the grade level dean or school administrator.

Dress for Success

Liberty High School will be following Osceola School District Dress Code Policy. Points to remember: We expect the students to come to school *well groomed and dressed for a learning environment*. Collared shirts in hunter green, gold, navy and white are permitted. Pants, shorts or skirts in khaki or dark denim are permitted. Pants with holes or tears are not permitted. Skirts and shorts should not be any shorter than fingertip length. Pants, shorts and skirts should sit at the waist and not expose midriffs or undergarments. Student ID's are required to be worn at all times with the students photo facing outward. ID's can be clipped to the collar or worn on a lanyard. It is the Principal's discretion to make any modifications to the dress code policy when items or dress interfere with the learning environment or safety and wellbeing of the student body.

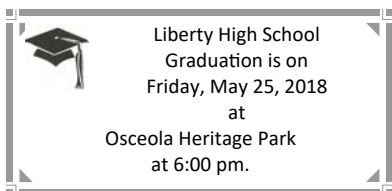
